PROGRAMME OF STUDY

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT

Year 12:

A level artists build upon the skills required at GCSE level, involving research and analysis, experimentation and refinement of media, reflecting on and exploring a brief, and producing final outcomes. In yr12, we explore the topic 'Strength', by exploring architecture, theology, self identity and the natural world.

Pupils are expected to develop independent essays around an area of personal interest from the world of Art and Design. Pupils are required to visit galleries, and go into great depth to show understanding of the context of art, as well as its value.

Summative: Teachers provide exemplar graded artwork, that allows pupils to self assess. Teachers discuss progress with pupils on a weekly basis, and formally grade work alongside the pupil. Once a term pupils are given A level grades that reflect the quality and value of their coursework at that time.

Formative: Pupils are given the tools to self and peer assess, which is imbedded in each and every lesson. Teachers develop pupils literacy skills by giving verbal feedback, which is written by the pupil next to their artwork.

Year 13:

Pupils are given an external brief from EDEXCEL, and use skills and processes previously developed to work towards a 15 hour final outcome.
