I am so very grateful that we have a supportive parent body - exemplified by the many positive communications we regularly receive and always so gratefully received. Please don't ever underestimate the impact of a positive email, card or letter and thank you for taking the time to do so.

I am sure that your children commented to you about the assemblies that were so well delivered earlier this term by a group of our year 11 students (with Mrs Simmons) that focused upon **Safer Spaces** around College. The assembly message was developed in the aftermath of the brutal murder of Sarah Everard and the subsequent testimonials on the *Everyone's Invited* website (mentioned in the last edition of Acta). One of the key messages was having the courage to 'call out' inappropriate behaviour; something that will take time - but time which will have been well spent if it changes societal behaviour for better

Whether they mentioned the Safer Spaces assembly or not, I hope that you and your children have healthy discussions about such events and websites - and more pertinently, that you discuss their use of social media. Please ensure that your children are aware that you are fully supportive of the College's view about social media use. I hope that you are aware of - amongst other things - the well publicised age restrictions for particular Apps, the content of their everyday social media traffic, their contacts and particularly important - the amount of time they actually spend on social media platforms. If you are not, then I suggest you take some time quickly to change that situation. The College cannot be held responsible for your child's use of social media, yet there is an increasing impact on College life as a result of the misuse of it by an increasing minority of our young people.

I would be concerned if your daughter or son was reluctant to show you any aspect of their phone's contents. Feel free to contact us for help and support if you face any challenge with this.

Congratulations to Year 11 and 13 for successfully completing their academic years. In the case of Year 13, having completed their journey with us, we wish them well as they begin their next stage without us. We have a number of events planned to celebrate these memorable rites of passage.

content, or simply to register what you think of Acta. Have a restful and peaceful half term break as we move closer to the end of the Covid restrictions.

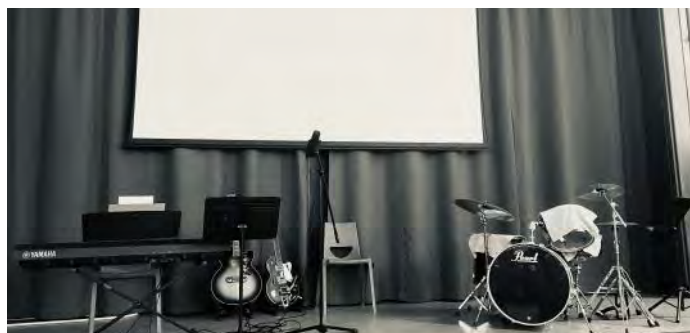

■ **Our Catholic Community**

For the first half of this term we observed Easter-tide and continued to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

This term is a great one in terms of the liturgical season, where we collectively build up momentum after the Feast of the Ascension to the birth of the Church at Pentecost.

Earlier in the month, we were able to focus on our College Saint, St Richard Reynolds, and remember how in 1535, he was executed in London for refusing the Oath of Supremacy to King Henry VIII of England. A zoom Mass was celebrated by Canon Peter Newby from St Margaret of Scotland Parish. This followed almost 2 weeks later with the Feast of the Ascension, and Monsignor Bill Saunders from Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish in Sheen kindly celebrated another zoom Mass for our whole school community.

Although we have been unable to be physically together on these occasions, our students still participated in classrooms and Hugo and Honor (Head Boy and Head Girl) read the Word, with Y9 students creating the prayers of intercession.

Youth Alpha

We are delighted to be leading a Youth Alpha course with a group of Year 9 students. Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that freely explore the basics of the Christian faith. Here at SRRCC, we provide a safe space for honest and open faith conversations and are supporting each other in our faith journey. The students have been thoroughly engaged in the material and in the discussions that follow. It is a privilege to listen to our young people. Mrs Fernandes, Science Technician, says, "I can't tell you how good I feel that I am part of this whole programme. There is a lot we can learn from our children."

As part of the College's Fun, Faith & Future initiative, the College is currently organising an Enrichment Week for our students in the final days of the academic year. We have been working with a group of year 7 and year 8 students to get their feedback on our current school lunch provision. This will continue after half term as we are looking at how our school lunches will look once Covid restrictions are lifted and we will communicate this in due course.

The year 7 and 8 students have provided some valuable feedback and we have identified some immediate improvements that can be actioned as we start after half term, including:

- Use of blackboards outside the canteen outlining the choices on offer that day so that students know which queue to join.
- Continuing the Pasta King option that has proved to be popular with students but improving the salad bar and bread options to go with this.
- Introducing theme days again.
- Increasing the options available to students, including increasing the number of jacket potato fillings and changing some dessert options.

Modern Foreign Languages

The MFL department is excited to announce a new course starting this September for the incoming Year 7s: Maximum Classics! SRRCC students will now have the opportunity to spend a year exploring the ancient world through mythology and literature, history and archaeology of both the Greeks and the Romans. Civilisation topics will range from Achilles and the Olympics to mosaics and Boudicca. The course will also introduce the basics of two ancient languages - Greek and Latin - in a way which is designed to support students' vocabulary building and grammar in English.

This term the current Year 9 have been trying out the Ancient Greek taster sessions and were pleasantly surprised to find that they already knew a lot of the Greek alphabet from their Maths and Physics lessons. They were soon able to read transliterated English words as well as real ancient Greek words and start finding some of the many derivations in our own language.

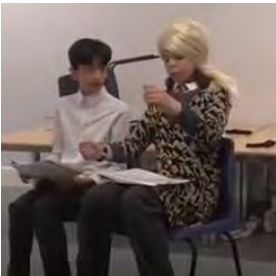

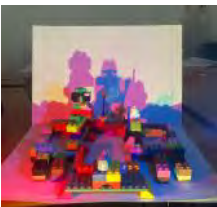
Year 8 students have been creating some live scripted performances.

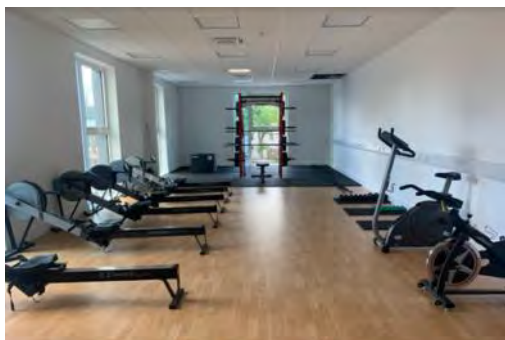

■ Careers & Work Experience



As career professionals we have a duty to go beyond the statutory guidance to provide our students with a sense of hope, optimism and ownership of their future. While exams and qualifications are important, they are no longer enough, and students will also need to develop their career knowledge, skills and attitudes to be competitive in the job market. At the end of April, we started running mentoring sessions with the intention of raising our students' career aspirations. A group of our Year 10 students were given an amazing opportunity to meet on a weekly basis with our brilliant volunteer Claire. She is a business leader and a professional coach with a wealth of experience in talent management and organisational change. Claire also worked within consulting, coaching and senior HR roles and students have been very positive about these sessions.



A pivotal part of providing good career information, advice and guidance is also labour market information (LMI). LMI can provide us with insights into different jobs and opportunities, telling us useful information such as - growing/declining sectors, salary, working hours, qualification/skills needed, future jobs etc. We recently read an interesting article about a growing sector - **landscaping**. The demand for landscapers is on the increase with British Association of Landscape Industries seeing an increase of over 60% in work orders and expecting business to continue to rise in the future with up to 30% recruitment requirements in the next 18 months. The landscape industry directly employs nearly 200000 people and contributes 6.8 billion to the UK economy. This along with Landscaping being cited as the UK's '**happiest profession**', could make a great career choice. The long awaited Skills for Jobs White Paper was finally published at the end of January. The white paper represents this government's first serious engagement with career guidance and we are hopeful that this is the beginning of a bigger process of reform and investment in England's career guidance system which is so needed. You might be already aware that if your child is a non-UK, EU citizen, in order to be eligible for UK University fees (rather than international fees which are considerably more) you will need to obtain EU Settled Status. The application deadline for this is 30th June 2021. This is a one-off deadline, not an annual deadline. If your child wants to apply to university in the UK at any point in the future, then we recommend exploring EU Settled Status and applying if you think it is appropriate for you.
