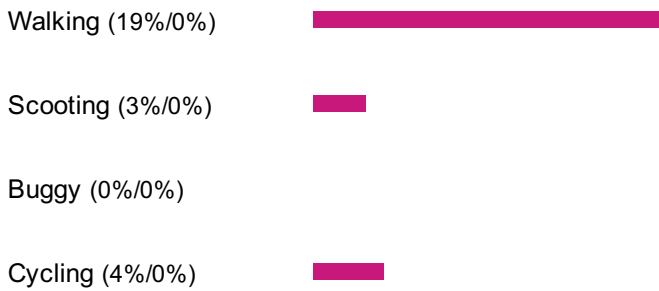

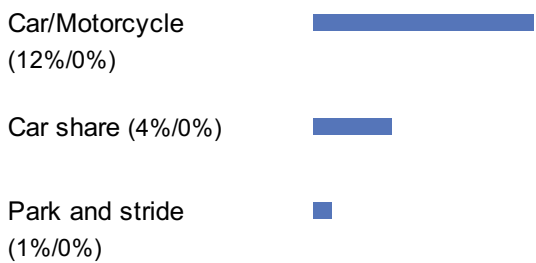

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## Thames Environmental Eco Day

### Our story

Year 3 will be visited The Thames Explorer Trust on Wednesday 30th November 2022. This was part of their Flow topic and allowed the pupils to have an immersive experience of riverside fieldwork. Children will had the opportunity to use a range of scientific equipment to record simple abiotic data including temperature, depth, velocity and state of tide. They also assessed water quality through chemical tests. Children observed first hand the river features including meanders and islands and key river processes including erosion, transportation and deposition. Pupils used the local environment to gain experience in identifying and naming birds and other animals living in this environment.
