It teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep, and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals. | This project teaches children about food and farming and explores themes, including where food comes from, what plants and animals need to grow and survive and what constitutes a healthy lifestyle. | This project teaches children about the global community to which they belong and explores how living things, communities and climates differ around the world. | This project teaches children about the animals that live around the world, how to look after animals and the importance of caring for our local and global environments. |

They explore how shadows are formed and how they can change. | This project teaches children about water, including floating and sinking, freezing and melting, and why it is important for living things to stay hydrated. |
