In the bible it says "The Lord looks down from heaven on all mankind to see if there are any who understand, any who seek God."

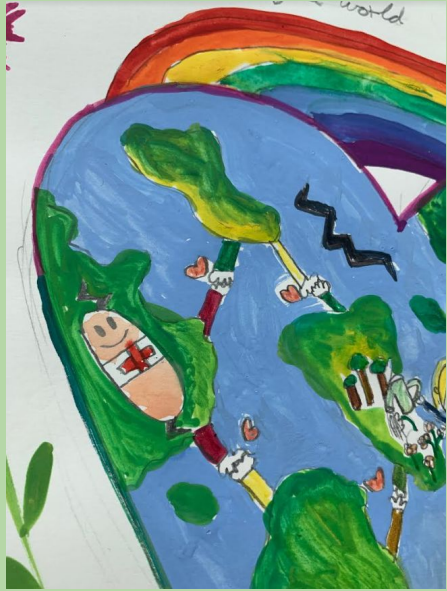
I imagine that God sees the world like in my sewing picture. If we are talking or singing to him he can look after it. That makes me feel happy.
